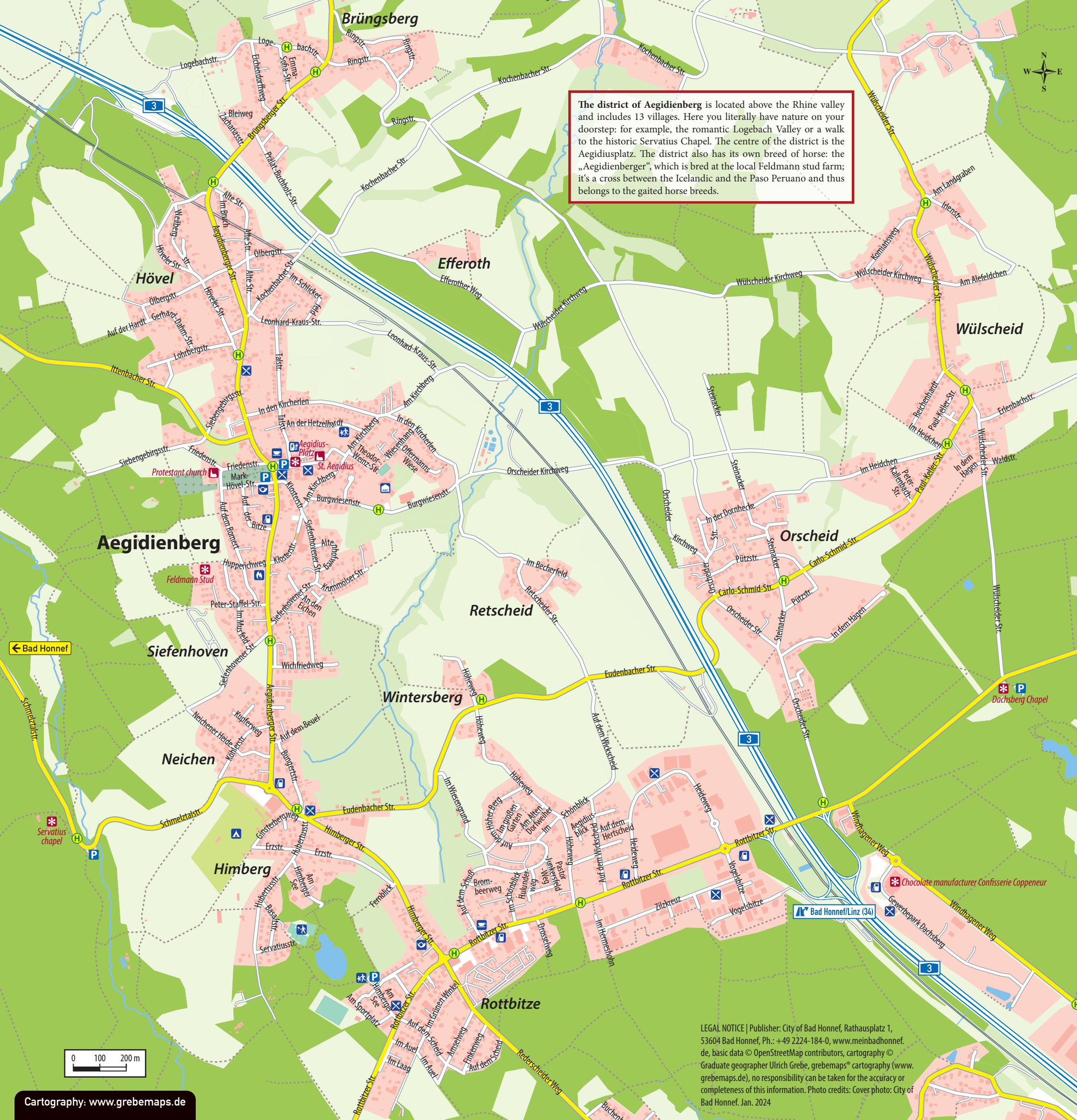

Holiday on the Rhine River



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The district of Aegidienberg is located above the Rhine valley and includes 13 villages. Here you literally have nature on your doorstep: for example, the romantic Logebach Valley or a walk to the historic Servatius Chapel. The centre of the district is the Aegidiusplatz. The district also has its own breed of horse: the „Aegidienberger“, which is bred at the local Feldmann stud farm; it's a cross between the Icelandic and the Paso Peruano and thus belongs to the gaited horse breeds.

The historic **forest cemetery** is the resting place of Konrad Adenauer and Peter Scholl-Latour. It is an enchanting place to visit simply because of the mystical, peaceful atmosphere in this special cemetery surrounded by woodland.

Bad Honnef, located directly on the Rhine and on the edge of the Siebengebirge nature reserve, offers a variety of leisure and recreational opportunities.

Discover the town for yourself - a few tips:

Visit the Adenauer House: Konrad Adenauer lived in Rhöndorf until his death in 1967. His former home with its beautiful rose garden and a permanent exhibition about his life and work offer insights into the life of the great statesman.

Walk the history trail: The "Bad Honnef history trail" takes you through the town's districts and information boards provide insight into the historical significance of private and public buildings, alleys, streets and squares, as well as to interesting points about the landscape. A folding map with the individual stations is available for each Bad Honnef district at the tourist information (Stadtinformation) (explanations in German only).

Hiking in the Siebengebirge: The Rheinsteig trail runs right

along the edge of town and the peaks of the Siebengebirge afford visitors panoramic views. There is no better way to explore the Siebengebirge nature reserve than on the many hiking trails.

Visit the island of Grafenwerth: Directly on the shores of Bad Honnef there are 2 islands in the Rhine, Nonnenwerth (not open to the public) and Grafenwerth. A visit to Grafenwerth should not be missed on any visit to Bad Honnef! Stroll along the Rhine promenade amidst extensive parklands, or take a boat trip along the Rhine. The town's most beautiful haven is always worth a visit.

Stroll through the picturesque town centre: with its villas from the Wilhelminian period, small fine stores and cosy pubs, the town centre offers a wonderful starting point for an extended stroll.

Fancy exploring the area by e-bike? Our tourist information offers a pedelec rental service. Advance reservation is recommended.

Kurhaus: Formerly referred to as "Rhine Riviera", Bad Honnef looks back on a long history as a health and recreation resort. The newly renovated Kurhaus from 1907, which used to be the centre of the spa activities, now shines in fresh splendour and has blossomed into a prestigious event space.

Hohenhonnet: Built in 1891/1982 in the style of French palaces, Hohenhonnet was a TB sanatorium until 1979. Today it is a rehabilitation centre for people with disabilities.
